

## Project: Helping Some Brilliant Students to Continue Education, 2011

Hridoya Bangladesh (HB), a non-profit organization, launched its first project back in 2007 with a view to promote education among underprivileged population of our country. Since then, it has taken various initiatives to financially support poor but brilliant students at different stages of their education. Sponsoring higher secondary education of talented students is one such effort taken by HB since 2007. With the generous help of its patrons, HB was able to continue this project for 2013 HSC examinees. 19 highly talented students (who passed SSC exam in 2011) from remote places of Bangladesh were supported throughout their college education with monthly stipend, admission and registration fees.
